- Romantic love is one of the main causes of gender violence















Gender-based violence is associated with a specific age, cultural and educational level

Scientific Evidence

Age

Around 120 million girls under the age of 20 (about 1 in 10) have been subjected to forced sexual intercourse or other forced sexual acts at some point in their lives (UNICEF, 2014)

30% of women (aged 15 and older) have suffered at least one time sexual or physical violence from their partner, sexual violence from others, or both (UN Women n.d)

In most countries, adolescent girls are at the highest risk of being forced to have sex: 15 million teenage girls, aged 15 to 19, have experienced forced sexual relations (UN Women n.d)

Social class, culture, ethnicity

GBV affects women of all ages, socioeconomic backgrounds, countries, cultures, ethnicities, etc. (Stöckl et al., 2014; Trygged et al., 2014; United Nations Department of Economic and Social Affairs, 2015).

Educational level

Gender violence is also present in educational centres, at all educational levels including universities with special emphasis on the most vulnerable groups (Valls et al., 2016)





















GV only or mainly in stable relationships

Scientific Evidence:

- Gender-based violence has been wrongly associated only with stable relationships, but it is also present in sporadic relationships.
- Different studies analyse gender-based violence in scornful flirting in nightlife settings.







