




























Love and attraction are shaped by social interactions:

- Relationships established




































Coercive Dominant Discourse

• The discourse that is imposed by the media and also by the peer group, which presents the profiles of men and boys with aggressive attitudes and behaviour as more attractive.



















Which models "are conveyed" to us as more attractive even if they are not?

- The coercive dominant dicourse impose these idees
- The coercive dominant discourse wants you to think this is true for all the world, but it is not true.
- Many people have a crush with "good" people















 - TV Series





































25% of adolescents experience psychological or physical abuse while dating (James, West, Deters y Armijo, 2000)

Girls who had been assaulted in high school were more likely to be assaulted in their first year at university and so on (Smith, White & Holland, 2003)

The possibility of being a victim in youth has more to do with violent relationships in adolescence than abuse in childhood (Smith, White & Holland, 2003)








Socialisation into attraction to violence does not change with age

6) The good new!! Because it is social, it can be changed




















Transformation of what "comes from the inside", towards the relationship you dream about
